Double-headed earrings made of stone or glass are a special form of ornament, possibly a type restricted to Sa Huynh people of a particular profession or status. At the jar burial site of Giong Ca Vo, southeast of Ho Chi Minh City, a skull with this kind of earring in situ was discovered, showing clearly that these ornaments were used as earrings and not as neck pendants.

“Sao La” is the local name of an animal belonging to an unknown genus that was rediscovered in 1992 in the mountain areas of central Viet Nam. This animal must have had a special meaning or value for the Sa Huynh people 2,000 years ago.
